English

In English, the children have written excellent newspaper reports for the *Orangekrant*, focusing on the Dutch Resistance during World War II. They have used strong language and historical understanding to produce some truly impressive pieces of writing.

All children have brought a copy of this work home for you to read- please do take the time to look through it with them- they are all amazing!

Maths

We have now completed our chapter on measurement and are moving on to reasoning and word problems, applying the skills the children have learned so far. We are also revising key areas of maths in preparation for SATs.

Thank you to the parents who are supporting children at home, especially when they get questions wrong. I have seen this reflected in homework and am blown away by the level of support - it is really helping the children progress.

Guided Reading

We are coming to the end of our class text *The Little Match Girl Strikes Back* by Emma Carroll. The children have been completely engaged, often sitting on the edge of their seats each lesson.

We have explored themes of strikes, women at work and working conditions in Victorian times, making links to the Suffragettes and discussing how these issues connect to children's rights today through our Rights Respecting work.

Science

In Science, the children have produced fantastic non-chronological reports about the circulatory system. These are high-quality pieces of work and show how hard the children have been working.

History & Geography

Geography: we are learning about settlements, exploring what makes a city, town or village, and understanding how settlements develop.

History: We have returned to one of our favourite topics - the Windrush Generation - making links to our English work earlier in the year.

PE

The children have absolutely loved getting the gymnastics equipment out this half-term and continue to enjoy weekly dodgeball sessions with Miss Weaver.

Art

In Art, the children are developing their observation and sketching skills by drawing fruit, using magnifying glasses to notice fine details, texture and shading.
