English

- ❖ Our new sequence of learning is based on the book 'Odd and the Frost Giants' by Neil Gaiman which is set during the Viking era. The children have already demonstrated a fantastic understanding and have made links with the Viking learning a lot of them completed last year. They have loved discussing the way the Vikings lived and how they used to raid and invade in their long ships. But were they simply fierce, blood-thirsty warriors?

Maths

- ❖ All children have come into school each day, settling straight into Early Bird Maths – a great way to start the day and to warm our brains up! In maths, all children have started learning around their understanding of place value. Children have counted in 25s, 100s and 1000s and used place value.

Science

- ❖ This half-term, Shark Class are learning scientific enquiry skills through our topic called 'Practical Skills'. They will learn about what makes a fair test and about controlled, independent and dependent variables. Ask your child what makes a fair test?

Geography

- ❖ The children are learning all about coasts and seas and we began by talking all about the seaside and coastal areas of the UK. I thoroughly enjoyed hearing the beautiful coastal areas you and your children had been to over the holidays. They will also learn about the human and physical features of these coastal areas: including cliffs, coast, waves and tides.

PSHE

- ❖ In PSHE, we are learning about 'Being Me in My World' – we will be developing our class charter based on the UN rights of a child. Children will be learning about what makes a good citizens which links to our school vision of learning for life.
