Welcome back

Firstly, I would like to welcome all pupils, parents and carers to Wolf class. After a challenging couple of years, I would like to thank you all for your continued support. Children have adapted well to their new class and it has been a pleasure getting to know them over the past couple of weeks. Already children have produced some fantastic work and engaged in new experiences. We have an exciting half-term ahead and I am looking forward to watching the members of Wolf class grow throughout the year.

English

- Our new sequence of learning is based on the book 'Beowulf' by Michael Morpurgo. Children have already demonstrated their understanding of suffixes, superlative adjectives and figurative language. Children have also enjoyed discussing how the story originated from the oldest surviving epic poem in Old English and still includes some of these features. Children are working towards writing their own heroic legend narrative.

Maths

- In maths, children have started by building on previous place value knowledge – Year 5 children have been introduced to numbers up to 1 million and Year 6 have been working with numbers up to 10 million. Children have started to compare and order numbers in ascending and descending order.

Science

- This half-term, Wolf class will be learning about particles and chemical change. We have started by describing the arrangements of solids, liquids and gases. Throughout this topic, we will develop our understanding of how particles change and when chemical reactions take place.

Geography

- This half term, children will be learning about our coldest regions 'The Polar Regions'. We will be investigating how these regions are affected by humans and what we can do to change the future. The children will be looking at lines of longitude and latitude, different climate zones and comparing the two Polar Regions.

PSHE

- In PSHE, we are learning about 'Being Me in My World' – we will be developing our class charter based on the UN rights of a child. Children will be learning about what makes a good citizen which links to our school vision of learning for life.
