I hope it provided you with an outline of learning that will take place in Wolf class this year and outlined the expectations of home learning – children have now been introduced to Freckle Maths and should therefore be able to access this from home. #### English

- This week, we have finished our literacy text 'Beowulf' by Michael Morpurgo. All children have thoroughly enjoyed the story and are now preparing to write their own historical story. Children are expected to apply their learning such as adverbial phrases, punctuation for parenthesis, compound adjectives and noun phrases in their writing. I can't wait to share their end results with you all.

#### Maths

- In maths, Year 5 have started to round numbers to the nearest 10 000 and 100 000 and Year 6 have been learning how to solve expressions using BIDMAS. Children have now been introduced to Freckle maths and should now access this at home daily.

#### Science

- This week, we have been learning how impure substances are represented using particles. Children understand that impure substances are mixtures with more than one type of particle. Children are able to draw diagrams showing how different types of gold are impure and represented. Next week, we will look at what happens to particles when dissolved.

#### Geography

- Over the past couple of weeks, children have been identifying countries that inhabit the Arctic Circle and learning how lines of longitude and latitude are used to identify a specific world location. This week, we took our learning outdoors before applying our learning in our books.

#### Computing

- Wolf class are learning all about the importance of online safety in computing. As children are spending a lot of time online, we feel it is important that all children understand how to stay safe online. This week, children have been learning all about receiving emails from strangers. Children are able to determine what should not be accepted and who to report it to.

We are the first class to reach one million words on our reading word count. Well done Wolf class – your engagement with home reading is excellent and you must keep this up all year.
