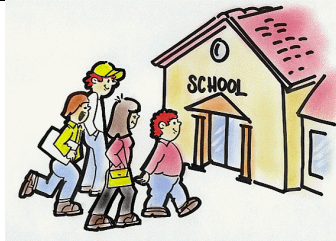




Home learning activities- weekly plan

Maths

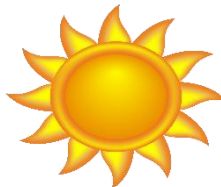


Rhyme of the week <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=TjmGTbNlj6Q>
