

Maths		<u>Number Hunt</u> - Practise recognising numbers to 10 by going on a Number Hunt around your home. Where can you see numbers? Look on clocks, remote controls, food packets, kitchen appliances etc. Hold up the right number of fingers or have a try at writing the number when you spot one!  <u>MiniMash</u> - Log onto Purple Mash and explore the "Numbers" pin on our MiniMash page. You can practise your numbers with a slideshow, jigsaw, pairs game or paint project.
