- Attend parents' evenings as well as other meetings about my child's progress.

- Offer and maintain an inviting and safe learning environment.
- Inform you of your child's progress at regular meetings.
- Keep you informed about what teachers aim to teach the children each term.
- Send home regular homework with clear explanations and give feedback.
- Keep parents informed about school activities through regular letters/emails, newsletters, text messages and notices about special events.

- Support your child's learning to help them achieve their best.
- Encourage your child to adhere to the school rules.

- Ensure that we all take care of the school environment and equipment.
