**Attendance:** Attendance is currently at its lowest in the 9 years that I have been at Whiston Willis and is the most important area that we really do need your support with.

We understand that we all can get ill, but we have seen far too many children with too many broken weeks in the last term which means having random single days off in any week.

In line with our attendance policy and Knowsley School Attendance Service advice, we will be asking for medical evidence to enable us to authorise absences for children who have attendance below 90%.

Unauthorised absences can lead to referral to Knowsley attendance service, warning letters and ultimately prosecution.

I hope you will work with us this term to reduce the number of broken weeks across school for all our children. They all have one chance at school so attending every day really does matter!
