

#### Dear Parents/Carers,

I hope you all had a lovely half term break and enjoyed some quality family time despite the typical weather for the time of year!

The children have returned to school in a very positive frame of mind and have been focused on their learning well this week. Even in just four days back at school, I have had a number of visits from children with their learning and the progress they have made since September is fantastic to see.

We are now into the second half of this academic year and this is such a key time for all the children to deepen their learning of their current curriculum so that they are well prepared for the next academic year.

I do really need to raise the issue of punctuality with you all as parents. The school day begins at 8:40am and the children do start the day with maths immediately. This is a planned teaching and learning time and an opportunity for children to deepen their mathematical fluency.

It may seem crazy but that time every day the children are in school equates to nearly 50 HOURS OF MATHS.

#### Learning for Life

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Attendance: Attendance at school continues to be something that we really do need your support with.
