




Home learning activities- weekly plan

Activities : Phonics, Literacy, Maths, Physical Development, Understanding of the World, Expressive Arts and Design		
Phonics/ Literacy 	<p>Phonics - Please watch our Read Write Inc set 1 speed sounds at 9.30am each day on: https://www.youtube.com/channel/UCo7fbLgY2oA_cFCI9GdxtQ The sounds covered this week are c,k,u,b,f and there are lots of activities to support this learning on the “Reading and Writing” section of MiniMash.</p> <p>Book of the Week. Watch “Let's build a house” https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=YBhJ807p2j8 and learn the key words, roof, window, walls, door, chimney. Can you find them on your home?</p> <p>Writing –Busy fingers, can you draw a picture of your house? What shapes have you drawn?</p>	
Maths 	<p>Shapes all around - Can you think of some buildings that are near to your house? Look out of your window, can you see any shapes on the buildings near you? What shapes are the windows, doors, roofs, chimneys, bricks?</p> <p>Busy builder -Can you find any empty boxes (cereal boxes, cardboard tubes etc) and use them to make your own building? Use card, paper, paints to make windows, door, roof. What shapes have you used? If possible, take your project outside, can you create your own building site?</p>
