Phonics

This week the children have been fully immersed into lessons. During phonic lessons children have learnt the sounds 'm,a,s,d,t'. Children have had opportunities to form these letters. Please support your child's phonic journey by recapping on taught sounds using pure sounds. You can access a video on YouTube to support the pronunciation of pure sounds. <u>Literacy</u>

Within Literacy, our focus story is Where the Wild Things Are. The children discovered a sack within the classroom containing various items. They have been working hard to draw and label the items as part of their written work for this week.

Maths

For Maths, children have been enhancing their subitising skills. Spotting dot patterns quickly without the need of counting them. Children have used paint to create patterns of 3 in different ways and use their language to describe these.

<u>General</u>

Our PE day is a Monday. Children come into school dressed in their PE kits on this day. Please ensure children are wearing school items and no football kits or tracksuits to be worn. Within PE, the children are developing the fundamental skills of balance, agility and coordination. Each lesson will be developing these key skills to support children physically.

Please ensure your child has their name written in <u>all</u> items of clothing including coats, shoes and bags. This would help us to prevent any pieces of clothing from being misplaced or lost.
